VISTIOR GUIDELINES

Visitors are welcome during open hours when accompanied by a member gardener. The gardeners and garden management work hard to provide a pleasant, inviting, and safe environment in the garden. There is **24 HOUR ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE** by the Oakdale Police Department. The Community Garden is a point of pride in our community. Please help us by adhering to all the following rules for access.

Garden Hours: Winter: 8am - 5pm Spring/Summer/Fall: 8am - 7pm

- (1) The Community Garden assumes no responsibility for injury. You may not remain in the garden after posted hours, unless you are a member gardener or accompanied by a member gardener.
- (2) **No trespassing in any area or building** which is fenced or locked. Trespassing and violating these guidelines is unlawful.
- (3) Do not use any utility or outlets in the garden.
- (4) **Do not liter** leave no bottles, cans, broken glass, paper, trash, clothing, or other debris of any kind in the garden.
- (5) **No tobacco products (**lighted or unlighted) are allowed in any area of the garden.
- (6) **Do not deface, damage**, write upon, remove or otherwise damage any garden facilities, improvements, fixtures, buildings, or equipment.
- (7) Visitors may **not cut**, **remove**, **or harvest**, **fruit**, **vegetables**, **or flowers** from any garden box or in ground garden plot.
- (8) **Do not remove** any soil, rock, sand or gravel from the garden.
- (9) **Do not harass**, catch, chase, or kill, any bird or any animal in the garden.
- (10) **Dogs are not allowed to run at large in the garden.** They must not enter restricted pet areas. Pet waste must be cleaned up upon leaving the garden.
- (11) Do not indulge in indecent or riotous conduct or language in the garden.
- (12) No alcohol allowed in the garden.
- (13) All who enter the Community Garden agree to the guidelines listed here and to comply with any lawful order of the garden management or the Oakdale Police Department in the enforcement of these rules and guidelines.
